A Note for Contributors

Crossings: ULAB Journal of English Studies is an annual peer-reviewed journal of scholarly articles and book reviews. Crossings is open to accept articles from teachers working at private and public universities of Bangladesh. But anybody from any profession or no-profession at all can send submissions for consideration for publication. Crossings also welcomes contributions from abroad.

Thematically the articles should be on English Literature and Language and how they relate to human behaviour and society and to the more-than-the-human world. Though articles on other literatures and languages are also welcome, but they must be written in English. Moreover, *Crossings* wants to welcome articles that explore ecological issues in literature.

All articles submitted should be written in English. Quotes and extracts in other languages may be given with parallel English translation. Each article is submitted to at least one reader on a panel of reviewers. Editing, for the sake of clarity and space, is done, but on a very minor scale. The articles and book reviews submitted to *Crossings* should not have been published or be under consideration for publication elsewhere. Only articles/reviews recommended by the reviewer will be accepted for publication.

All submissions may be done online, while hard copies with CD may be submitted too. All articles should follow the in-text documentation method, that is, the MLA Style Sheet, preferably the 6th edition, though the 7th edition is now available in the market. The upper limit for an article is 6000 words and lower is 3000 words, though in case of an exceptionally well-written paper, the word count will be relaxed.

Crossings will be published in October, at the beginning of Fall Semester, every year, but submissions will be accepted throughout the year.
